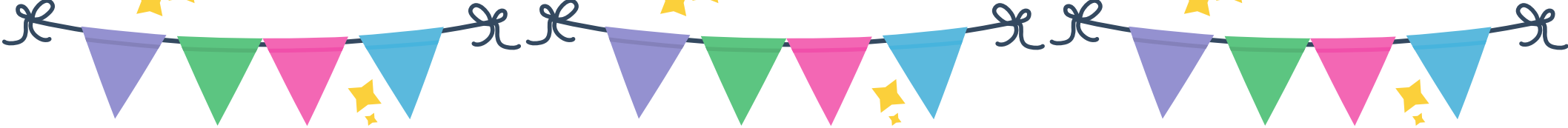

Craft: Create an Islamic Hijri calendar wheel with movable months and days.

Islamic Connection: Teach children the names of Islamic months and their significance (like Ramadan, Dhul-Hijjah, etc.).





Chapter -6

Dua Jar

Craft: Decorate a jar where kids can write down their duas and put them in.

Islamic Connection: Teach the power of dua, mentioning specific duas children can easily learn.

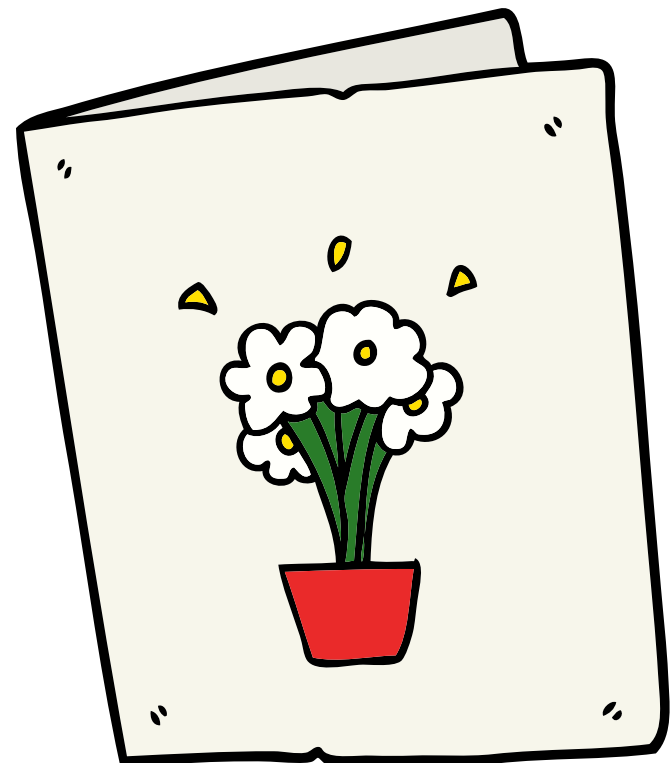


Chapter -7
